

ASPA History

What is the Adventist Student Personnel Association (ASPA) all about? A legitimate question and maybe one that you have raised!

Just for the record ... here's how it all began. At the 1975 Dean's Workshop at Andrews University, Dr. Mercedes Dyer encouraged those in attendance to consider the advantages of a professional organization for Seventh-day Adventist residence hall deans. Gary Dickson from Atlantic Union College; Faye Blix, from Walla Walla College; David Penner, from Greater Miami Academy, and Donald Murray, from Blue Mountain Academy, were challenged by the potential and spent many hours brainstorming. Soon the rough draft of a constitution was written and a name chosen. They called the fledgling organization the Association of Seventh-day Adventist Residence Hall Deans (ASDARHD).

The machinery moved slowly until the fall of 1977. Dickson and Murray moved to Andrews University that year. As they talked about ASDARHD, Dickson and Murray decided that the original vision was too small. Included in the organization should be members from all branches of Student Services. About 50 men and women met for an organizational meeting at Columbia Union College, March 15-19. They had no money, but they had a vision. There was no name, but there was a need.

The beginnings were not without frustration. Some were certain that an official organization would never get off the ground. Others saw little future in having academy and college personnel within the same structure. A few thought that this organization would stifle spontaneity, creativity, and professional development.

As part of the discussion, Dr. Dyer suggested an official name, the "Adventist Student Personnel Association." Thus, ASPA was born. David "Bud" Dickerson, from Loma Linda University, was elected as the first president. Before long, Dickerson was Dean of Students at Atlantic Union College, and some organizational development took place on that campus. A logo was selected, stationery was printed and the first two conferences were planned under Dickerson's leadership.

The Second National Conference was held at Loma Linda University in 1979, and Gary Dickson, Associate Professor of Counselor Education at Andrews University, was chosen as president-elect. He became the second ASPA president.

ASPA was formed to promote the principles of Christian education with primary emphasis on student development. ASPA was formed to help its members strive toward ethical and professional excellence. ASPA was formed to identify and communicate about methods and materials for the professional development of the members. ASPA was formed because there was a need and there was a vision.

A HISTORY OF PUBLICATIONS FOR SDA STUDENT SERVICE PROFESSIONALS

The Window: Journal for SDA Student Services Professionals, began in 1986, and yet, it is really not a new publication. It is a continuation of a tradition that began in the early years of the Seventh-day Adventist educational program. Our first educational institution was Battle Creek College, and in its first years of operation the leaders sensed a need for educating the whole person in all branches of development: mental; physical; social; spiritual; vocational; and family life, with the values which would enhance Christian living and witnessing.

“School homes” were available for all students at Battle Creek College by 1886. Professor W. W. Prescott and his wife, Daisy, were the first “preceptors” or deans as they are called today. Prescott was also the president. Study was given to the programs and services at some of the most renowned institutions of that time who offered on-campus housing for its students. Ironically they were all institutions for women! At Battle Creek College, students who did not live at home were now required to live in the school home. Teachers were required to help support the high standards of the school home. This became a model for “after” schools in the Seventh-Day Adventist educational system. Periodic administrative conventions had special meetings for the persons in charge of the residence halls or school homes, as they were then called. By 1929, the General Conference of Seventh Day Adventists (GC) Department of Education had commissioned a book entitled *The School Home Manual*. It was authored by Alma Graf. She served as a Preceptress from 1909 to 1932 at Emmanuel Missionary College, Washington Missionary College, and Pacific Union College. This resource is now out of print, but very much loaded with excellent instructions for residence hall personnel. Copies are available in most SDA school libraries. An enlarged paperback manual also appeared in 1952. This was a handbook with chapters contributed by a number of deans covering important topics and issues faced by deans.

THE DEAN'S WINDOW

The Dean's Window, as a publication, began in 1942. Number 1 of the first volume was dated October 21, 1942. It was largely devoted to reporting impressions of the dean's convention held at Emmanuel Missionary College (now Andrews University), August 6-19, 1942. Residence hall deans at Adventist colleges and sanitarium nursing schools from all over the U.S. and Canada were present. A list of the deans present was given with expressions of the enthusiasm they had for the convention.

One of the important resolutions of that 1942 convention was:

“Resolved that we present a request to the proper authorities for a newsletter, to be compiled eight times a year, beginning with October, with Mary Lamson, General Editor, and each dean and the supervisor of nurses' residences as regular contributors; the expense to be defrayed chiefly by the colleges; the sanitariums and academies to be invited to subscribe for fifty cents a year.”

The newsletter was a reality. Mary Lamson, a retired dean of 33 years experience, went home from that dean's convention and began the publication which has continued until today, with only a change of name and frequency of publication dates. Beginning in the fall of 1986, The Window was published six times a year. Currently it is published five times per year.

Where did the name, The Dean's Window come from? Dr. O. E. Randall, for many years dean of Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island, had published a book, The Dean's Window. This book has been read and reread by many of our deans. It was filled with “sage observations and witty comments that a man of long experience in this work was likely to make.”

Permission had been granted by him to use his title. In the November issue, a letter from Dr. Randall is quoted in part:

“Please accept my thanks for a copy of “The Dean's Window” which arrived a few days ago, and which I have enjoyed reading very much. . . Those of you who are looking after the education of youth are conscious that students are not simply mental containers to be filled with knowledge, but rather young human beings possessed of such spiritual possibilities awaiting the sturdy hand of spiritually minded teachers. . . There must also be a close and intimate relationship between teachers and students. The teacher must know and thoroughly understand the nature and the aspirations of the student before he or she can be trusted with the delicate task of developing such important possibilities. . . Once more, I am sure that you will agree when I say that having successfully developed the mental and physical possibilities of our youth, there remains the important obligation in education; namely, the development of the spiritual qualities, without which so-called education may be a dangerous thing in the hand of anyone.”

Thus, The Dean's Window began with Mary Lamson as its first editor. With her, Walter Crandall and Rachel Christman served as associate editors. Marie Jansen was the make-up editor. Since Mary Lamson lived with her niece, the address changed from Meridian, Mississippi in 1942, to Nashville, Tennessee in 1944. Marie Jansen was able to use the facilities of the conference office in the publishing of The Dean's Window.

For ten years, Mary Lamson was the spokeswoman for deans. She encouraged them to be professional, spiritual educators, and Christian models. In 1946 associate editors changed to Pearl Rees of Union College, Dorothy Foreman-Beltz of Walla Walla College, and Robert Reynolds of Atlantic Union College. Some issues were assigned to special editors.

When her health declined, the editorship passed from Lamson to Pearl Rees at Union College. She too had been a residence hall dean for thirty years. Monte Culver and Ruth Mosby were her associate editors from 1952-1955. At that time, other associates, Ernestine Burkett, M. S. Fisher, and Mercedes Dyer were appointed. Rees suffered from failing eyesight and was forced to resign in 1957.

The GC Education Department had helped support the paper with postage and incidental expenses when needed. Elder E. E. Cossentine, then the GC Director of education, asked Mercedes Dyer to take over the editorship. She had been a residence hall dean for seventeen years and was at Columbia Union College as the Director of Guidance. Associate editors were chosen from among those who had attended the first graduate course for deans offered by the SDA Seminary. Dyer had assisted with the teaching of this course. The next two years, Ruth Ingram, Mike Loewen, Eleanor Spoor, and John Ward served as associates. John Ward continued as associate until 1964 and Mike Loewen until 1969. Arlene Friestad, dean of women at Andrews University, began as associate editor in 1961 when Dyer moved to Andrews University. Friestad prepared a number of issues, selected articles, requested permission to reprint articles, and gave valuable help during her years at Andrews University.

In 1975, Readings for Residence Hall Directors was published, with Mercedes Dyer and Nelson Evans as editors. Featured were selected articles from The Dean's Window. In 1979, Dyer and Evans published a second book of "readings."

When Dyer retired in 1983, Gary Dickson, Counselor Educator at Andrews University, became editor. Then, in September, 1984, Donald Murray became editor, with Myrna Walters and Gary Wisbey of Union College as associates. It was during Murray's editorship that the name and format were changed to The Window with bimonthly issues coming out six times a year.

For the many years The Dean's Window/ *The Window* was published by the GC Department of Education. Five editors did the work with the help of their associates: Mary Lamson, 1942-1952; Pearl Rees, 1953-1957; Mercedes Dyer, 1957-1983; Gary Dickson, 1983-1984; and Donald Murray, 1984-1996. In 1996 The Window became the voice of ASPA. Also in 1996 a decision was made by

ASPAs to elect an editor every two years. This decision effectively ended the financial support given by the GC. Fortunately by 2002 the financial support was restored. In 2003 the term of office was increased to three years.

ASPAs NEWSLETTER

The ASPAs Newsletter was first edited by Faye Blix in 1978. Its purpose was to provide news to the emerging professional organization, ASPAs, and to promote the ASPAs conferences and regional activities. The editors of The ASPAs Newsletter, in addition to Faye Blix, were:

On April 8, 1986, ASPAs voted to merge The ASPAs Newsletter with The Dean’s Window, thus forming *The Window*.

A TEXTBOOK AND RESOURCE FOR TRAINING

Called to a Ministry of Caring: a Dean’s Guide to Residence Hall Leadership, is the latest publication for the profession. In 2001 “Advent Source” published the first book for members of the student services profession that was commissioned by the GC Department of Education. Author, Donald Murray, shared his experience, his love for the profession, his deep respect for the gift of Christian education, and his devotion for Adventist young people. At the time, Murray was the Dean of Men at Andrews University.

THE WINDOW

The Window, Journal for SDA Student Services Professionals, is the result of a decision made at Southern College of SDA, April 8, 1986. There, ASPAs members voted to merge the ASPAs Newsletter, printed two to three times per year since 1978, with The Dean’s Window. Dr. George Akers, Director of the Department of Education at the GC, gave his support for the merger in June of 1986. The first issue of *The Window*, as it was called, was the September/October 1986 printing.

ASPA MAJOR HISTORICAL EVENTS

July 5, 1975 Constitutional Committee chosen at Residence Hall
Dean's Workshop, Andrews University. Committee
members: Faye Blix, Walla Walla College; Gary

Dickson, Atlantic Union College; Donald Murray, Blue Mountain Academy; and David Penner, Greater Miami Academy.

- March 19, 1978 The name, “The Adventist Student Personnel Association” was recommended by Dr. Mercedes Dyer, Chair of the Education Department at Andrews University, during the first conference at Columbia Union College. This name was chosen, and the constitution ratified. Officers elected were: President David “Bud” Dickerson, Dean of Men, Loma Linda University; Treasurer Donald Murray, Associate Dean of Men, Andrews University; Communications Secretary Faye Blix, Dean of Women. Walla Walla College. Dues were fixed at \$10 and were due at the conference date each year.
- March 20, 1979 Gary Dickson, Counselor Educator at Andrews University, was chosen to be the first president-elect.
- March 25, 1980 Constitution revised to include vice-presidential positions for residence hall programs and for counseling and guidance programs; the various conferences of the North American Division were designated as ASPA regions, with each region being led by a regional director. Donald Murray of Andrews University, was the first Vice President for Residence Hall programming, and Floyd Wood of Loma Linda University, was the first Vice President for Counseling and Guidance Programming.
- March 28, 1981 ASPA Awards Program voted, with the first awards to be given at the 1982 Conference. The Awards Program was begun through the leadership of Donald Murray, Vice President for Residence Hall Programming.
- March 23, 1982 Recipient of the first ASPA award was Dr. Mercedes Dyer, for Excellence in Service. The Assessment for Residence Hall Staff Development (The ARHSD), developed under the leadership of Donald Murray, was adopted as the official pre-service/in-service evaluation instrument for residence hall deans. The ASPA Constitution was revised to state that dues should be paid by March 1 of each year.
- March 17, 1983 ASPA Constitution revised, stating that dues should be paid on the anniversary of when they were originally paid.

- August 15, 1984 EUR-ASPAs organized by Donald Murray at Newbold College, Bracknell, England. Members came from schools in what was then called the Northern European Division.
- March 28, 1985 EUR-ASPAs accepted as an official ASPA Region. The first EUR-ASPAs director was Hokan Lillbach, Dean of Men at the Swedish Junior College, Ekebyholsskolen.
- April 7, 1986 The ASPA Newsletter merged with The Dean's Window and became The Window. The (GC) Department of Education had subsidized The Dean's Window, and the \$2,000 subsidy continued, with Andrews University and the GC Department of Education serving as the publishers.
- March 25, 1988 "Residence Life Educator Certification Committee" was appointed, with Donald Murray serving as Chair. Other committee members were Farrel Brizendine of Pacific Union College, Herb Fermantes of Gem State Academy, Dwight Magers of Shenandoah Valley Academy, Lynita Mayer of Loma Linda University, and Sandy Pride of Rio Lindo Academy.
- July 6, 1988 South Pacific ASPAs organized by Donald Murray at Camp Howqua, Victoria, Australia. Attendees came from schools in the South Pacific Division.
- March 19, 1989 South Pacific-ASPAs accepted as official ASPA Region. First South Pacific ASPAs Director was Adrian Flemming, Dean of Men at Sydney Adventist Hospital School of Nursing. Residence Life Educator certification program was approved. The first chair of the Certification Review Committee was William Wohlers of Southern College of Seventh-day Adventists.
- March 31, 1990 Donald Murray became the first Certified Residence Life Educator (CRLE). Constitution revised. Dues were to be paid by July 1, of each year. The position of Vice President for Student Services added as an executive officer of ASPA. Patricia Stewart, Director of Career Planning and Placement at Andrews University, became the first ASPA Vice President for Student Services.
- March 22, 1991 ASPAs dues set at \$30 per year. Student membership remained at \$10 per year.

- July 5, 1991 EUD-ASPAs organized in Darmstadt, Germany by Donald Murray. Attendees came from schools in the Euro-African Division.
- March 20, 1992 EUD-ASPAs accepted as an official ASPA Region, The first EUD-ASPAs Region Co-Directors were Rainer Isecke and Wolfgang Stammler of Marienhoehe Seminary.
- July 9, 1993 DIA-ASPAs, organized in Montemorelos, Mexico by Donald Murray. Membership came from schools in the Inter-American Division.
- March 18, 1994 DIA-ASPAs accepted as an official ASPA Region, March 18, 1994. The first DIA-ASPAs Director was Abraham Murillo, Director for Student Affairs, Montemorelos University. Vice President for Residence Hall Programming became Vice President for Academy Residence Hall Programming and Vice President for College Residence Hall Programming upon the recommendation of Kari Shultz, who presented the request to ensure academy representation. Kay Sanborn, of Auburn Adventist Academy, was the first Vice President for Academy Residence Hall Programming, and Stan Hobbs, of Southern College of SDA was the first Vice President for College Residence Hall Programming.
- April 8, 1994 EURO-ASPAs was organized in Kikhavn, Denmark, merging the former EUR-ASPAs and EUD-ASPAs Regions. Attendees came from schools in the Trans-European and Euro-African Divisions. The first EURO-ASPAs co-directors were Maureen Smith of Newbold College and Wolfgang Stammler of Friedensau Theological Graduate School. Donald Murray represented ASPAs officers as the merger took place.
- March 17, 1995 Constitution revised. Membership dues are to be paid by December 1, each year. Dues set at \$35 per year. Student membership remained at \$10 per year.
- March 16, 1996 Constitution again revised. Ex-officio office of Communications Director became the Vice President for Communications, who shall serve as editor of the

bimonthly professional publication, *The Window*, and the Treasurer became the Vice-President for Finance. Voted to assume full responsibility for publication of *The Window*. The GC Department of Education subsidy of \$2000 was lost in the process.

- March 15, 1997 Voted to grant the President a \$400 stipend; the Vice-President for Finance and Vice President for Communications each a \$200 stipend.
- March 7, 1998 Voted to increase dues to \$50 per year. Student membership remained at \$10 per year. The stipend to specified officers was thoroughly discussed and reaffirmed: President- \$400; Vice President for Finance-\$200; and the Vice President for Communications-\$200.
- March 12, 1999 First ASPA funds invested in a Certificate of Deposit. Voted to extend the term of Certification Review Committee Chair to three years.
- March 16, 2000 Tax exempt status secured through both federal government and state of California. First stages of incorporation explored.
- August 13-16, 2000 ASPA set up a booth at the NAD Teachers' Convention in Dallas, Texas.
- March 15, 2001 Voted to establish an ASPA Student Conference Scholarship. Executive officers any refine the scholarship, eligibility and deadline as needed.
- March 16, 2002 ASPA celebrated its 25th anniversary conference. Gary Dickson, Robert Sutton, Dr. George Akers, Dr. Mercedes Dyer, and Donald Murray, were honored at the closing banquet.
- March 15, 2003 Voted to extend the term of Vice President for Communication and Vice President for Finance to three years. Voted to develop the certification program to include all members of ASPA, with the designation for certification as a Student Development Educator (CSDE). Voted to include the Lifetime Achievement Award, recognizing individual's significant contributions to student development/ASPA.

- March 3, 2004 Voted to accept the proposed certification program:
Certified Student Development Educator (CSDE).
- March, 2005 Many amendments were made to the Constitution and Bylaws, the most significant was the inclusion of Article IX Section 3 which allows the bylaws to be amended by simple majority of the Association quorum with a recommended 24 hours advance notice. A mission and vision were created. Two academy scholarships were awarded to new deans who qualified.
